A day in the life

NICU VESTIBULE — 6:14 PM

An access event fires at the NICU vestibule: a badge without NICU privileges holds the door open twice in ninety seconds. Corvexa pulls the nearest camera automatically, classifies it as a **high-severity controlled-zone breach**, and attaches the unit's SOP — notify charge nurse, verify badge holder, lock down adjacent doors — before the alert ever reaches a phone. Security confirms a visiting physician used the wrong reader and logs the resolution in under two minutes. The full record — every event, every action, every timestamp — is already in the audit trail for the unit's next Environment of Care survey.
